

Save Water Outdoors for Water Conservation Month

April is Water Conservation Month. This month is traditionally one of the driest of the year and marks the peak demand season for public water suppliers.

CFWI leaders especially encourages conservation throughout April on top of year-round conservation. Residents can participate by being mindful of water use in their everyday outdoor activities.

Here are some tips on saving water outdoors:

- Water your lawn and landscape only when it is needed, such as when footprints are left when you walk across the grass.
- Maintain your irrigation system. Watch for broken or misdirected sprinklers. Check for leaks and clogged spray heads.
- Apply fertilizers sparingly and follow the manufacturer's directions on the bag, in terms of the amount per application.
- Equip hoses with automatic shutoff nozzles for car washing, hand watering, etc.
