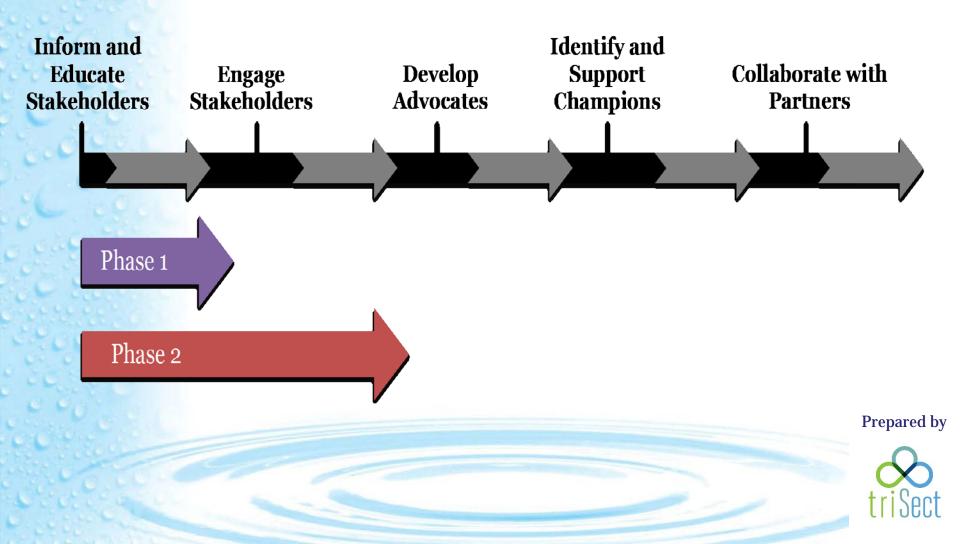

### What they did:

### What they learned:

- Coordinated communication is critical
- Having third party perspective is beneficial

## **External Engagement**

### What they did:

- Interviews with subject matter experts and county managers
- Local government and business community workshops

#### What they learned:

- Local leaders want a collaborative process
- Active, on-going participation is key to successful longterm policy and funding solutions
- The value of water is not "top of mind" -- but needs to be
- Willing to support CFWI if tools are provided
