

To help guide Central Florida's water future, the area's first multi-district regional water supply plan (RWSP) has been drafted, which identifies water source options and potential projects to meet projected demands.

The draft Central Florida Water Initiative (CFWI) RWSP was completed in 2014. There are more than enough project options identified in the RWSP to meet the region's 250 million gallon per day demand projected deficit.
