

Polk Regional Water Cooperative – Alternative Water Supply Projects


- Adopted resolutions designating \$65 million for AWS projects with the Polk Regional Water Cooperative (PRWC)
- Two Lower Floridan aquifer (LFA) brackish groundwater projects currently under development by the PRWC



Polk Regional Water Cooperative - Southeast Wellfield

- Project Scope: 30 mgd LFA wellfield, water treatment facility and transmission system
- Total Cost: \$446 million
- Status: Preliminary design underway
- Development of first two phases by 2027, 12.5 mgd capacity





Polk Regional Water Cooperative - West Polk Wellfield



- Project Scope: 15 mgd LFA wellfield, water treatment facility and transmission system
- Total Cost: \$204 million
- Status: Conceptual design underway
- Development of first phase by 2027, 5 mgd capacity





CFWI Water Conservation Process

- FDEP authorized unallocated funding under an SFWMD contract to be developed into a joint CFWI WC Program
- January FDEP and Districts met to formulate a plan
- February 17 Application released
- March 27 Application period closed
- April Internal review team
- May Management review and Steering Committee approval
- June Governing Board approval, if applicable
- July Execute agreements

General Project Requirements

- Project located within the CFWI Planning Area
- Applicants must be able to fully fund the project as this is a reimbursement program
- Total project costs must be at least \$15,000 for water supply utilities, municipalities, or government agencies
- Costs related to project implementation
- Eligible expenditures incurred between July 1, 2020 and November 30, 2022



Review Considerations

- Quantity of water saved
- Cost-effectiveness of project in dollars per 1,000 gallons (\$/kgal) of water saved
- Quality and detail of project planning
- Project readiness
- Environmental/community benefits
- Water source
- Past performance

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

In FY2019-2020, \$40 Million was provided to implement Alternative Water Supply Projects, roughly **20%** of the allocated funding is dedicated to CFWI Projects
